My name is **Minja Petrović**, I come from Jagodina, and I am 26 years old. I graduated from the Faculty of Education in Jagodina, and today I living in Indiana, the United States. I finished my undergraduate studies in July 2021.

Throughout my third year at the Faculty of Education, I searched for the program abroad. Finally, the Russian and East European Institute at Indiana University stood out as the best choice. Therefore, at the beginning of my final year at the Faculty of Education in Jagodina, I started applying for a master's degree. Indiana University accepted my application in January of 2021 and in August I moved to Bloomington.

Currently, I am obtaining my master's degree at the Hamilton Lugar School of Global and International Studies. My major is in Russian and East European area studies, focusing on education. I got the chance to study abroad because of my proficiency in English and experience of living and studying in the field that the Russian and Eastern European Institute is focusing on.

Studying at the Faculty of Education helped me to get into the master's studies abroad in several ways. Firstly, I had a chance to study the English language during the entire bachelor program at the Faculty of Education in Jagodina. The English language module brought my proficiency to a more prominent level. Secondly, as a student at the Faculty of Education, I had a chance to study for one semester in Hungary as an Erasmus+ exchange student.
